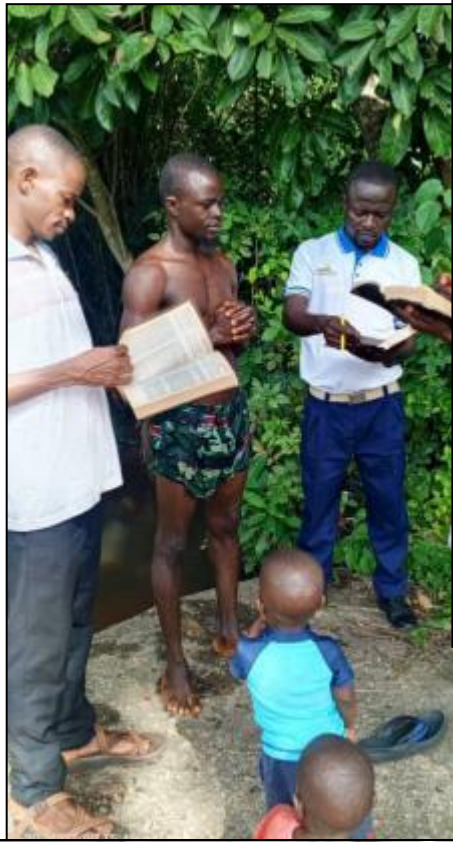

"It's a blessing serving the Lord as His goodness, kindness and abundant grace is given us always for His good pleasure forever. Amen. We have been more grateful to all for counting us worthy for His service of the kingdom. It has been a tremendous progress as compared in the past 10 years.

Remarkable things are done and are ongoing through the brethren effort and contributions home and abroad.

We are grateful for the bible school that is now a ground of edification and inspiration for brethren all around. The congregations are now benefiting greatly, enjoying the services of those trained from the school. Souls are being added on a daily bases by the involvement of students too.

Another achievement we are grateful of is the completing of the lodging which we are so happy and delighted for. The lodging is mainly for the students and visiting staff. It has been completed by the special grace of God and now ready for us. All this is by your contributions as brethren by His grace."

The final project proposal: The Assembly Hall

"The biggest target we are praying for is a multi-purpose hall on the school campus. This will be for worship, seminars, lectures and other gatherings for promotion of the Gospel. We wish to quickly get settled with physical developments (*infrastructure*) and then focus on constant spiritual activities and souls winning to build up the church. If this is achieved in short time, by His grace, we will be so grateful as we will turn entirely on evangelism and edification."



Plans for extended or satellite classes:

"The administration wishes to have extended classes at distance places to increase the number of trained preachers, evangelists and teachers.

It is observed that some brethren are still reluctant to leave their places to come for studies at the school. This, according to them, is due to the distance and other challenges.

Therefore, to help this situation, the administration, with the approval of the board, has decided to extend lectures to those places and render certificate/diploma courses to these brethren so that the true knowledge of scriptures can be passed. The classes are designed for two days in a week. That is, Fridays and Saturdays. So, we are seeking your help and prayers to seeing this plan accomplished by His grace."

Activities ongoing:

Constant edification is ongoing among congregations to strengthen maturity. The local congregations are being edified and strengthened.

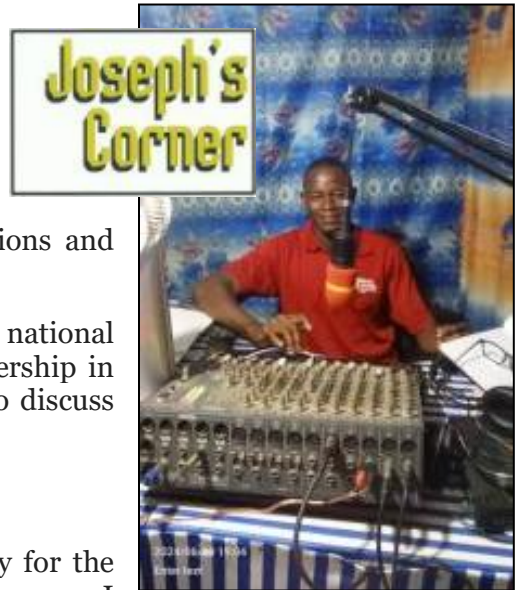
There are cross border activities in Liberia to help for mutual growth across the globe. There are also challenges of sitting accommodations and places of worship, some using public places for worship.

There is constant leadership engagement of the congregations at the national and local level. This is to organize programs and to help the leadership in structuring in the congregations for progress. The board also met to discuss the school affairs and progress.”

The Lord bless you richly in Jesus’ name.”



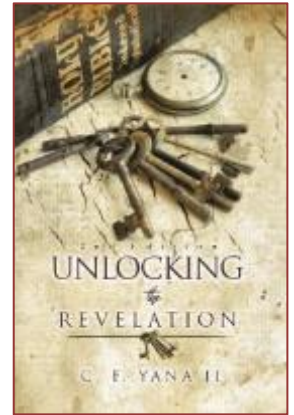
Joseph in Freetown.
