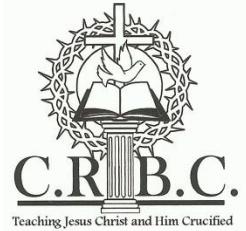

The Great Co-Mission

Jesus said to go into all the world and make disciples, baptizing them in the authority of the Godhead and continuing their education in the word of truth. The goal of the CRBC is to train preachers to do just that and to equip them with the tools necessary to continue that work. But even before the school starts its first class, the work of converting souls to Christ must continue. Joseph is shown here immersing two new sisters into the body of Christ. Pictured on the far right are these new babes



in Christ with Joseph's wife Victoria in their midst. Baptism is a 'burial' but in order to completely bury a penitent believer in such shallow water, they are to sit and cross their ankles with the foot of the one immersing them, holding their lower extremities completely under momentarily, before they rise to "walk in newness of life" (*Romans 6:4*). This is what washes away our sins and is necessary for a person to receive "a good conscience toward God, by the resurrection of Jesus Christ" (*1 Peter 3:21*). In the Great Co-mission Jesus continues His presence in that process, along with those who spread the Gospel of peace, until He returns (*Matthew 28:20*).

S.I.B.I. Affiliation

After some investigation into the idea of the Sunset International Bible Institute (SIBI) providing materials for the CRBC, it was understood beforehand that no matter where any and all materials originate they are to be vetted for scriptural accuracy and doctrinal purity by knowledgeable, unbiased and humble brethren (*as the Bereans- Acts 17:11*).

Having received electronically the required courses with prerequisites for school certification (*etc.*), the CRBC is in the position to begin classes once the furniture is installed. Those requirements include a list of necessities needed in place in order to become an associate school of SIBI. (*All property, obtained by the support of brethren in the US, is owned by the Koindu Church of Christ in which SIBI has no vested interest.*)

Sierra Leone



Sierra Leone was a British Crown Colony from 1808 to April 27, 1961 when it achieved independence, but periods of political turbulence have marked its recent history. On 19 April 1971, Siaka Stevens' government abolished Sierra Leone's parliamentary government system and declared Sierra Leone a presidential republic. Sierra Leone Colony and Protectorate lasted until 1961 when it gained independence from the United Kingdom, with Elizabeth II as Queen of Sierra Leone. It retained her as head of state for a decade until 1971, when the country became a republic. (Wikipedia) Koindu is home to the CRBC; the location is shown by the red arrow.
