Traveling from congregation to congregation is also a good way to introduce the CRBC.




These are some of the other brethren Joseph fellowships in his travels; some of which are in need of encouragement and to be strengthened.

Sierra Leone

The **Sierra Leone Civil War** (1991–2002), or the **Sierra Leonean Civil War**, was a civil war in Sierra Leone that began on 23 March 1991 when the Revolutionary United Front (RUF), with support from the special forces of Charles Taylor's National Patriotic Front of Liberia (NPFL), intervened in Sierra Leone in an attempt to overthrow the Joseph Momoh government. The resulting civil war lasted 11 years, enveloped the country, and left over 50,000 dead.

As the UN mission began to fail, the United Kingdom declared its intention to intervene in the former colony and Commonwealth member in an attempt to support the weak government of President Ahmad Tejan Kabbah. With help from a renewed UN mandate and Guinean air support, the British Operation Palliser finally defeated the RUF, taking control of Freetown. On 18 January 2002, President Kabbah declared the Sierra Leone Civil War over.


Wars are the results of a lack of having God control the thoughts and actions associated with the human nature. Only with the truth can mankind truly be free (Heb 4:12).
