Pro 21:1 The king's heart is a stream of water in the hand of the LORD; he turns it wherever he will.

Pro 21:2 Every way of a man is right in his own eyes, but the LORD weighs the heart.

Pro 21:3 To do righteousness and justice is more acceptable to the LORD than sacrifice.

Pro 21:4 Haughty eyes and a proud heart, the lamp of the wicked, are sin.

Pro 21:5 The plans of the diligent lead surely to abundance, but everyone who is hasty comes only to poverty.

Pro 21:6 The getting of treasures by a lying tongue is a fleeting vapor and a snare of death.

Pro 21:7 The violence of the wicked will sweep them away, because they refuse to do what is just.

Pro 21:8 The way of the guilty is crooked, but the conduct of the pure is upright.

Pro 21:9 It is better to live in a corner of the housetop than in a house shared with a quarrelsome wife.

Pro 21:10 The soul of the wicked desires evil; his neighbor finds no mercy in his eyes.

Pro 21:11 When a scoffer is punished, the simple becomes wise; when a wise man is instructed, he gains knowledge.

Pro 21:12 The Righteous One observes the house of the wicked; he throws the wicked down to ruin.

Pro 21:13 Whoever closes his ear to the cry of the poor will himself call out and not be answered.

Pro 21:14 A gift in secret averts anger, and a concealed bribe, strong wrath.

Pro 21:15 When justice is done, it is a joy to the righteous but terror to evildoers.

Pro 21:16 One who wanders from the way of good sense will rest in the assembly of the dead.

Pro 21:17 Whoever loves pleasure will be a poor man; he who loves wine and oil will not be rich.

Pro 21:18 The wicked is a ransom for the righteous, and the traitor for the upright.

Pro 21:19 It is better to live in a desert land than with a quarrelsome and fretful woman.

Pro 21:20 Precious treasure and oil are in a wise man's dwelling, but a foolish man devours it.

Pro 21:21 Whoever pursues righteousness and kindness will find life, righteousness, and honor.

Pro 21:22 A wise man scales the city of the mighty and brings down the stronghold in which they trust.

Pro 21:23 Whoever keeps his mouth and his tongue keeps himself out of trouble.

Pro 21:24 "Scoffer" is the name of the arrogant, haughty man who acts with arrogant pride.

Pro 21:25 The desire of the sluggard kills him, for his hands refuse to labor.

Pro 21:26 All day long he craves and craves, but the righteous gives and does not hold back.

Pro 21:27 The sacrifice of the wicked is an abomination; how much more when he brings it with evil intent.

Pro 21:28 A false witness will perish, but the word of a man who hears will endure.

Pro 21:29 A wicked man puts on a bold face, but the upright gives thought to his ways.

Pro 21:30 No wisdom, no understanding, no counsel can avail against the LORD.

Pro 21:31 The horse is made ready for the day of battle, but the victory belongs to the LORD.

Pro 22:1 A good name is to be chosen rather than great riches, and favor is better than silver or gold.

Pro 22:2 The rich and the poor meet together; the LORD is the maker of them all.

Pro 22:3 The prudent sees danger and hides himself, but the simple go on and suffer for it.

Pro 22:4 The reward for humility and fear of the LORD is riches and honor and life.

Pro 22:5 Thorns and snares are in the way of the crooked; whoever guards his soul will keep far from them.

Pro 22:6 Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it.

Pro 22:7 The rich rules over the poor, and the borrower is the slave of the lender.

Pro 22:8 Whoever sows injustice will reap calamity, and the rod of his fury will fail.

Pro 22:9 Whoever has a bountiful eye will be blessed, for he shares his bread with the poor.

Pro 22:10 Drive out a scoffer, and strife will go out, and quarreling and abuse will cease.

Pro 22:11 He who loves purity of heart, and whose speech is gracious, will have the king as his friend.

Pro 22:12 The eyes of the LORD keep watch over knowledge, but he overthrows the words of the traitor.

Pro 22:13 The sluggard says, "There is a lion outside! I shall be killed in the streets!"

Pro 22:14 The mouth of forbidden women is a deep pit; he with whom the LORD is angry will fall into it.

Pro 22:15 Folly is bound up in the heart of a child, but the rod of discipline drives it far from him.

Pro 22:16 Whoever oppresses the poor to increase his own wealth, or gives to the rich, will only come to poverty.

Pro 22:17 Incline your ear, and hear the words of the wise, and apply your heart to my knowledge,

Pro 22:18 for it will be pleasant if you keep them within you, if all of them are ready on your lips.

Pro 22:19 That your trust may be in the LORD, I have made them known to you today, even to you.

Pro 22:20 Have I not written for you thirty sayings of counsel and knowledge,

Pro 22:21 to make you know what is right and true, that you may give a true answer to those who sent you?

Pro 22:22 Do not rob the poor, because he is poor, or crush the afflicted at the gate,

Pro 22:23 for the LORD will plead their cause and rob of life those who rob them.

Pro 22:24 Make no friendship with a man given to anger, nor go with a wrathful man,

Pro 22:25 lest you learn his ways and entangle yourself in a snare.

Pro 22:26 Be not one of those who give pledges, who put up security for debts.

Pro 22:27 If you have nothing with which to pay, why should your bed be taken from under you?

Pro 22:28 Do not move the ancient landmark that your fathers have set.

Pro 22:29 Do you see a man skillful in his work? He will stand before kings; he will not stand before obscure men.

New Testament

2Co 4:1 Therefore, having this ministry by the mercy of God, we do not lose heart.

2Co 4:2 But we have renounced disgraceful, underhanded ways. We refuse to practice cunning or to tamper with God's word, but by the open statement of the truth we would commend ourselves to everyone's conscience in the sight of God.

2Co 4:3 And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled only to those who are perishing.

2Co 4:4 In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God.

2Co 4:5 For what we proclaim is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, with ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake.

2Co 4:6 For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

2Co 4:7 But we have this treasure in jars of clay, to show that the surpassing power belongs to God and not to us.

2Co 4:8 We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair;

2Co 4:9 persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed;

2Co 4:10 always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies.

2Co 4:11 For we who live are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh.

2Co 4:12 So death is at work in us, but life in you.

2Co 4:13 Since we have the same spirit of faith according to what has been written, "I believed, and so I spoke," we also believe, and so we also speak,

2Co 4:14 knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and bring us with you into his presence.

2Co 4:15 For it is all for your sake, so that as grace extends to more and more people it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

2Co 4:16 So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day.

2Co 4:17 For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison,

2Co 4:18 as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal.
